- 03** Plant trees, volunteer or help care for gardens and parks (ex. at the Florence Fang Community Farm).

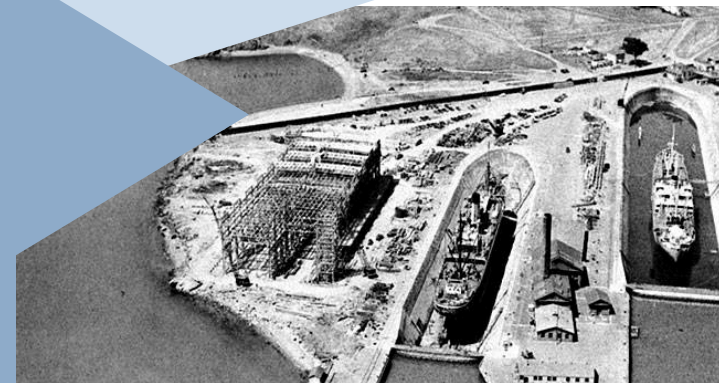
Health Risks

NAVAL SHIPYARD

Bayview–Hunters Point has several hazardous waste sites, like old Hunters Point Naval Shipyard, which still contains toxic materials like lead, asbestos, and radioactive waste.

THE IMPACT

When rising seas or floods hit these areas, they can spread dangerous chemicals into homes, schools, and parks. This puts kids, elders, and families at a serious health risk.



Wildlife Risk

Rising seas can flood wetlands and marshes, destroying homes for fish, birds, and other wildlife. Floodwaters can also spread pollution from toxic sites, harming animals, especially those living in the water.

This could impact:

- **Fish:** Chinook Salmon and Anchovies
- **Birds:** Western Sandpiper and California Gull
- **Crustaceans:** Dungeness crabs and shellfish.

What is sea level rise?

Sea level rise is an increase in the level of the world's oceans due to the effects of global warming.

Statistics

- Since **1880**, the world's average sea level has risen by about **8 inches**.
- **Sea level rise is caused mainly by:**
 - Melting glaciers and ice sheets.
 - Expansion of seawater as it warms.
- By **2100**, global sea levels could **rise by 1 to 4 feet**.

SF Bayview Hunters Point

The Bayview–Hunters Point neighborhood is a sea level rise vulnerability zone.
